


# ILLICIT DRUG TOXICTITY DEATHS: LOCAL CONTEXT


- How will pandemic impact the opioid crisis?
- Potential for border restrictions to severely limit local drug supply.




### **PANDEMIC IMPACTS**

# 2020 was B.C.'s deadliest year ever for drug overdoses, coroner says

1,716 people died due to illicit drug use last year, equating to 4.7 deaths a day — a 74% increase over 2019

- Nearly 5 British Columbians die per day
- In Vancouver, more than
  1 person dies per day
- More deaths than suicide, traffic collisions and homicides <u>combined</u>



#### **CURRENT STATUS**

Record number of illicit drug overdoses in B.C. in January

- 49% of all cases involved benzodiazepines (etizolam)
- Naloxone is less effective in combating benzodiazepines
- Resurgence of carfentanil

#### **VPD STRATEGY**

 Compassion for those with substance use disorder

- Local history of being progressive
- Recognize the need for a health led approach



## **VPD STRATEGY**

- Enforcement: focus on those doing the most harm
  - Importing
  - Manufacturing
  - Trafficking



#### **DECRIMINALIZATION**

- November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Vancouver Council motion
- December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020 written submission to Health Canada
- March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 first framework submitted
