

BACKGROUND

Providence Health Care (PHC) is the rehabilitation hospital of Unity Health Toronto. In September 2023, we developed an initiative aimed at celebrating rehab health providers, with a focus on promoting interprofessional learning and collaboration. Many healthcare providers, while highly specialized in their fields, may not be fully aware of how other disciplines and services holistically contribute to a patients' rehab journey. As a result, there is a need to bridge these knowledge gaps and encourage mutual understanding and respect for the diverse roles in teams.

PURPOSE

PHC's Rehab Day Celebration initiative had 3 main aims:

- 1. To provide a platform for showcasing the collaborative efforts that support a patient's recovery.
- 2. To encourage learning between disciplines by highlighting the work of various rehabilitation professional enhance understanding of rehabilitation services available and promote an appreciation of the full scope of care provided within our hospital.
- 3. To strengthen the hospital's culture of interprofessional teamwork, aligning with our organizational value of Community.


