- Virtual reality (VR) and augmented reality (AR) in rehabilitation
- Big data, data integration, and computational modelling
- Point-of-care and rapid diagnostic technologies

Theme 2: Interprofessional & Collaborative Approaches to Brain Injury Care

This stream highlights **integrated, collaborative approaches** that bring together diverse healthcare professionals and practitioners to improve outcomes for individuals with brain injury. We welcome proposals from teams and practitioners across healthcare, research, and community settings. Topics include, but are not limited to:

- Interdisciplinary rehabilitation models
- Collaboration between acute care, rehabilitation, and community services
- Patient- and family-centered care approaches
- Mental health integration in brain injury care
- Social determinants of health and equity in access to care
- Care transitions and continuity of care models
- Indigenous and culturally informed approaches
- Role of allied health professionals (e.g., OT, PT, speech-language pathology)
- Integration of clinical, research, and community partnerships
